Connections is an online scholarly journal published by the Foreign Language Association of Northern California and directed to the world language professional in the classroom. SUBMISSIONS

We have an open and permanent call for original articles. *Connections* only accepts manuscripts that have not been published or are not under evaluation for publication in any other peer-reviewed journal (in print or online).

Essays are peer-reviewed by members of the Editorial Board and other associated outside readers. **Please, see the Author Guidelines below.** The journal is published online-only, is fully refereed, and welcomes submissions of research articles, commentaries presenting innovative, individual pedagogical practices, and book reviews.

To ensure a blind review, do *not* include your name in the manuscript.

Research Articles follow the structure of research papers. 15 to 30 pages, double-spaced, Times New Roman 12, APA 7th ed. Manual. Research articles undergo a double-blind review.

Book Reviews are around 800-1000 words, double-spaced. Books for review shall be recent publications –no more than 2 years old. Reviews also follow APA 7th ed. Manual

DEADLINE

While submissions are welcome at any point, only manuscripts received by **June 1st, 2024** will be considered for the **Fall 2024** issue of the journal.

STYLE

APA Style (7th ed. Manual) is used for text, references, and notes. Detailed style guidelines, including examples, are available in the *Guidelines for Manuscript Preparation* on the ACTFL web site <http://www.actfl.org>

PUBLICATION ETHICS

Connections takes seriously any allegations of plagiarism or malpractice. Authors are expected to turn in only entirely original works with proper citations and credits to sources.

Should the research involve human subjects, authors are expected to turn in evidence of IRB approval.

In the same way, *Connections* editors consider any manuscript received confidential and will only share any information related to the manuscript with the author and/or reviewers involved as appropriate. Manuscripts submitted will undergo a double-blind review: The identities of the author and of the two reviewers will be concealed.

AUTHOR GUIDELINES

1. The manuscript submitted has not been published previously nor is it currently considered for publication in another journal, whether in print or online.
2. The research article or book review is no longer than the page-count or word-count described above for each type of manuscript. *Please, feel free to contact us in case of exceptions.*
3. The text is double-spaced, uses Times New Roman 12-point font, and employs italics rather than underlining. Illustrations, figures, and tables are placed within the text at the appropriate points. All pictures must be captioned. **Please, follow APA 7th ed. Manual style.**
4. In the case of research articles, please submit a brief abstract, around 100-120 words in length, and a list of 4-5 keywords with your article.
5. Book reviews also follow APA 7th ed. Manual style, have to be critical and informative, and not requiring major changes in order to be accepted.
6. As *Connections* serves a multi-lingual audience, all articles and reviews should be written in English.
7. Any author submitting an article or review to *Connections* must be a member of the Foreign Language Association of Northern California.
8. FLANC retains the copyright for material in the journal. Copying of material beyond that constituting “fair use” requires permission from the publisher. No article may have a commercial focus.
9. Editorial Report: An editorial decision on whether and when your contribution will be published will be communicated within 4-6 weeks.
10. A brief biographical note will be requested from authors whose manuscript is published.
